WEEKLY VALUES This week - COURTESY

At Avon House, we have a weekly value that we encourage pupils to focus on and at the end of each week, as part of our Celebration Assembly, each class highlights a pupil that has embodied this value.



We take a whole school approach (staff and pupils) to reflect upon these values. In Pre-Prep, the weekly value is highlighted and discussed throughout the week, before being celebrated on Friday. In Prep, on Mondays, pupils are given a stimulus to discuss the value in action and to then set themselves a target for demonstrating this value in their own school practice. On Fridays, we continue to celebrate pupils' achievements in reaching these weekly values in our whole School Assembly, but also create time during the day where staff and pupils can reflect on how well they did or did not do in meeting the targets they set on Monday.


READING CHALLENGE
