EXPLORING THE SENSES

Puffins have enjoyed tuning into a repetitive rhythm of the story of the week ('Brown Bear, Brown Bear'). All children are able now to recite the story themselves which helps develop their auditory memory skills. While we are on the topic of early literacy, 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear' also allows for increased comprehension skills. Children have created their own versions of the book by cutting and sticking the illustrations into their own little booklets.

Puffins have enjoyed their first Dance, Spanish and PE lessons this week. In their 2nd Music session they were learning about various instruments and their particularly loved the rainmakers and the sounds they were making.

Puffins had their first 'Taste Education' session during which they were exploring a cucumber using all their senses. The Taste Education approach equips children with the skills they need for developing a taste for healthy foods as well as the confidence to talk about their own preferences. Unfortunately the rain spoiled our chance to get outside and draw around each other with chalk, so we improvised and used paper and pen to draw and label the parts of Margot's skeleton! We finished the lesson by learning about the different functions of

the human skeleton and how certain bones are useful for different jobs.

ONE MORE

Year 1 were introduced to 'Pinocchio' in Literacy this week and created their first story map with actions to help retell the story. As the week progressed, everyone felt confident in putting the story in the right order and writing about key points.

In Maths, Pelicans and Cranes have been representing numbers with objects, filling the playground with number lines and looking at 1 more than a given number. The children are very keen to keep testing each other with their '1 more' number knowledge in class by questioning each other.

During Computing, both classes were testing their knowledge of giving directions by guiding their partner around to pick up a target while blindfolded. They were tasked with using precise language and keeping their partner safe at the same time. This is helping everyone understand how algorithms work.

Raef said, "I liked jumping to my numbers on the number line, I did numbers to 20. We've been doing one more in class but I like doing 1 less better."

Zelda spoke about Computing, "It was easy giving directions, sometimes I forgot and pointed and they couldn't see, so I had to think about my directions more."



LIVING AND NON LIVING IN YEAR 6

In Year 6 this week, we have been getting into our new class text, "War Horse," and focusing on how we can use vocabulary and description to write with emotive language. Pupils found it interesting in History to find out about World War I (the setting of the story) in preparation for our unit on World War II. In Geography this week, pupils got transported to North America, using an atlas to find the countries and major cities in this continent.

For Science, we took a walk around the school to find organisms that were both living and non-living, looking for signs of conditions for life (Movement, Growth, Reproduction and Excretion). Spencer and Kanhaiya from 6JM discovered bulbs in the planter, which caused a good debate when we got back to class. How would you classify a garden bulb Living or Non-living?!
