COLOUR WHEELS

Year 1 Cranes and Pelicans have thoroughly enjoyed developing their knowledge of the colour wheel in Art this week. The children adjusted the proportions of primary colours to create various shades and experimented with adding secondary colours to observe how the colours changed on their pages. They were also able to use different materials to paint with, such as cork, cotton wool, bubble wrap and foil, and compare how paint is applied differently depending on the material.

Science also had Year 1 jumping (and throwing!) with glee as they looked at understanding more about sight. Learning how an eye works, they estimated how many beanbags they could get in a bucket with both eyes open, one eye closed and both eyes closed. The results demonstrate that the bean bag toss will be one to watch at Sports Day in the summer term!

Joshua shared, "We were testing our eyes to see how they work. When my eyes were closed I missed the bucket - I need my eyes open to see!"

Daniel declared, "I like art, I like to paint pictures of Mummy and Daddy. My favourite colours are pink and blue, if you mix them you can make purple!"

LEARNING A NEW LANGUAGE

Learning a new language isn't easy, but our Year 2 pupils took it in their stride as they were introduced to how a computer thinks with binary coding this week.

Using two digits - '0' and '1', our pupils explored the various closed questions they could ask each other to receive a '0/no' or '1/yes' response. In classes, they worked out different ways to classify a group of friends using these questions.

To further aid their understanding of classification, they went on a bug hunt at The Wells. Thinking about the different identifying features of the insects they found (including a huge spider!), they use this to create a set of binary questions about the characteristics of mini beasts in their next lesson.

HELICOPTER STORIES

This week, we have introduced 'Helicopter Stories' to Puffins. It is a simple approach to supporting language development, storytelling and emergent literacy. It values children's creativity and imaginative play. The practitioner sits with the child, listens to their story, and writes it down word for word. Once all the stories have been scribed, we gather around a taped out stage, ready to act them out.

Children in the Puffin Class, have also enjoyed exploring 'Transient Art' using loose parts and natural objects such as conkers, pebbles, sticks and small wooden rings. Transient Art supports all areas of

development and learning from exploring positioning, patterns, symmetry, working cooperatively with others and exploring their own ideas. We have enjoyed talking about texture, shape, size, and differences in natural objects.

At Avon House, we recognise the importance and the benefit of taking the opportunity to connect with nature through our weekly walks. This week, Puffins went on a colour hunt and collected various autumnal leaves and looked for signs of Autumn.

During Taste Education session, Puffins have tasted red peppers and everyone has found them very scrumptious.

During PE session, teachers were focusing on developing children's eye-hand coordination, concentration and strength control through throwing and catching bean bags and jumping on the ladder.



YEAR 3 STOP MOTION ANIMATION

This week Year 3 have embarked upon a journey of discovery. They have become directors and film maker and very picky about seeing fingers in stop motion animation films.

These are the first attempt of the children in Year 3 at stop motion animation. A process by which movement is simulated between frames. If you asked the children they would say

"you have to make lots of small movements between frames and take lots of photographs... and when you press play it looks like it was all moving!"

Please enjoy the children's initial efforts, they worked very hard. To provide further context, it

takes 24 images to create one second of stop motion footage.
